# WHAT'S HAPPENING ON THE NICKEY LINE

## **Planning and Funding Issues**

### **Funds Obtained For Improved Surface East from Maylands**

Countryside Management Service report they have secured funds for re-surfacing in Dacorum to run from Maylands in the direction of Redbourn as far as the money will fund – probably somewhere around Hunters Oak.

#### **East Hemel Development**

In a meeting with the development team, we were informed that the planning application for East Hemel should be submitted around March 2020. The latest plans include the Toucan crossing we requested on the new north south road being driven through the Nickey Line plus proposals for improving the Redbourn Bypass crossing by the M1. Discussions on the latter are expected with Herts Highways and we have been asked to participate in these. We have recorded a disagreement over the lack of a ramp access at Cherry Tree Lane rather than the less attractive alternative level access eastwards via Wood End Farm being proposed.

#### Lawes Trust Proposals for Redbourn Lane Roundabout Crossing

The Lawes Agricultural Trust latest consultation indicated the bridge proposal had been dropped and the pedestrian / cycle crossing at the roundabout may be moved away from the roundabout but it is possible that traffic volume concerns may affect the final solution. The proposed development is still not in SADC's proposed Local Plan.

#### **Lottery Application**

The Friends continue to liaise with Countryside Management Service (CMS) on proposals for a lottery application by CMS to fund heritage enhancements along the Nickey Line.

## **Harpenden News**

#### Vandalism

The fixed metal panel at 5 Ways intersection was found lying against the gate which opens. A piece of the frame was left in the ground projecting by about 1 inch and was a trip hazard. St Albans DC contractors have made this safe.

## **Hemel Hempstead News**

#### New Ramps at Hunters Oak and Spencers Park

Two new access ramps have been constructed – one to Hunters Oak (almost finished at the time of writing) and one to Spencers Park, close together at the western end of the two developments. Hunters Oak now has 3 formal accesses but Spencers Park still only 1 – more will be needed to this growing development.

A bit of detective work indicated the correct slope figures to be pop riveted on and, a dash of paint later, there we have a much restored sign. We hope to add back a second arm soon too.

#### **Redbourn Lane Car Park Entrance Widened**

Following the Friends' request to Herts Highways to widen the entrance to avoid unnecessary risk of damage to users' vehicles, we are pleased to report this has been implemented. However, we continue to recommend users to go round the roundabout and turn right into the car park to enter as close as possible to 90 degrees (NB with care re the fast moving traffic).

# Dawn Chorus, Harpenden, Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> May at 5.45am, followed by Breakfast (provisional)

This event is being held jointly by the Friends and the local branch of the RSPB. This is the seventh time we have combined to run this biannual ever popular event, which will be held at Youth With a Mission at their site off Ambrose Lane Harpenden. Enter the site using the road alongside the Nickey Line by the Ambrose Lane bridge, and proceed to the back car park. There will be a charge for this event, details to provided later. #### Hemel Hempstead Spring Watch Walk (about 3 miles) Sunday 10 May at 10am

Meet in the Gadebridge Lane car park by the white bridge. Our route will follow rural footpaths for the main part, so wear stout footwear as the paths could be muddy. We will be looking for signs of Spring, so if you have binoculars, please bring them. #### Redbourn 4 mile walk, Sunday 14 June at 10am, visiting site of historical interest

This is likely to be a joint walk with the Ver Valley Society, but currently it is provisional. All will be welcome. *Details will be released later.* 

#### Redbourn Butterfly Walk, Sunday 20 July at 10am

Meet in the car park at the bottom of Redbourn Lane, or if full, use street parking in Harpenden Lane. This annual walk has been run at Harpenden in past years, and is becoming very popular, with 14 different species this summer. Because of this, attendees will be limited to a maximum of 20. To get to the main area of interest the walk is about 1 mile in total, but there is the option to walk a further mile taking in another excellent location. Wear stout footwear. # **Work Parties**

A number of work parties have taken place over and since the summer. Roger Green has encouraged a group of Hemel based volunteers to help with regular litter picks, and carried out further work creating good sight lines of the outstanding Cherry Tree Lane Bridge. Encouragingly, we will in future be covered by DBC for public liability insurance.

In Redbourn, the small orchard near Chequer Lane has recently been cleared of brambles and the coppicing towards Beaumont Halt was continued. Items that had been fly tipped were gathered in one location so that they could be cleared by St Albans DC. Also one sack of litter was removed. The latest working party consisted of Friends Volunteers plus CROWS (Community and Rights of Way Services) which resulted in 31 people – one of our largest ever work parties. We plan to cut the orchard again mid-summer to suppress the vigorously growing brambles. (This is due to happen on Wednesdays, weather permitting.)

Nearer Harpenden, the grass areas opposite Knott Wood were cut in late September, and the hedge line lowered to provide excellent views over the Ver valley. A number of large hazels

have been coppiced, and a section of hedge laid below Knott Wood. The Friends now have a scythe to help control young nettle and bramble growth. Opening up views of the Ambrose Lane bridge is planned for December.
